From the Philadelphia Ethical Pet Professionals website:

"The term "**behaviorist**" is too commonly used in the dog training community. CAAB (<u>Certified Applied Animal Behaviorist</u>) is the only professional non-veterinary certified to use the title, "behaviorist". There are strict educational and practice requirements to become a Certified Applied Animal Behaviorist. This includes having had to earn a Master's or Ph.D. degree in behavioral science with specific courses in animal learning, ethology, biology, zoology, and learning theory at accredited universities.

Otherwise, when speaking about "behaviorists" we are normally referring to <u>Diplomates</u> of the American College of Veterinary Behavior (DACVB). These are veterinarians who are specialists in the field. These specialists have completed a residency or training program in the discipline of veterinary behavioral medicine. You can locate a <u>board-certified veterinary behaviorist through their website</u>.
